
CARC Membership Dues are \$24 each year. Now's the time to submit your dues payment for 2017.

#### Ham Of The Year 2016: Kenneth Musson W8QKP Awarded at the 2016 Cherryland ARC Annual Christmas Dinner Party

Awarded at the 2016 Cherryland ARC Annual Christmas Dinner Party

The Cherryland ARC has a tradition of presenting a member with the "Bill Martinek W8JUY Ham Of The Year Award" each year. From the 50's to the 80's, Bill was "Mr. Ham Radio" for the CARC. Serving in nearly every office from President to Cherry Juice editor (one year he did both!), running nets, teaching licensing classes and participating at the Swap, W8JUY did it all. He was the owner of Martinek jewelers in the 200 block of Front Street and often provided the main door prize for the swap.

The award was established in 1993 when Bill became a Silent Key. The first recipient was Chuck W8SGR. Subsequent winners were Dave N8CN in 1994, Marion W8VWY and Bev Stoner K8ZJU in 1995, Joe W8TVT in 1996, Ward N8WK in 1997, Bill W8PIT in 1998, Norm K8CLM in 1999, Hope AA8SN in 2000, Dale N8VX in 2001, John KX8CW in 2002, Jeff K9JP in 2003, Jill KC8JVQ in 2004, Norm K8CLM and Chuck



W8SGR in 2005, Jon N8UL in 2006, no award in 2007, Don N8QX in 2008, Jim K8OJP in 2009, Ernie K8RCT in 2010, Mike W8VPC in 2011, Dave N8CN posthumously in 2012, Mike KD8REH in 2013, Joe N8CN in 2014, and Glen K8SGZ in 2015.



Originally, the award was a plaque but Joe W8TVT has ramped up the award with his hand-crafted beautiful lamps using vacuum tubes.

For 2016, Ken Musson W8QKP, was chosen to be the 2016 Ham of the Year. Ken is a long time member of the CARC and has been instrumental in making Field Day a success-- Ken is the "King of 20 Meters." It is a pleasure to watch him work the pile-ups he generates on Field Day! Ken was also instrumental in helping us get a matching grant from the Les and Ann Biederman Foundation to help fund the repeater upgrades this past year.

The Purple Crystal: A Column About Repeaters Joe Erlewein, N8CN

Welcome to the third installment of The Purple Crystal! In our first installment, we discussed the new site of the W8BNZ 147.040+ (PL 114.8) repeater high atop Crystal Mountain. Our second installment introduced the return of the W8QPO 147.100+ (PL 114.8) repeater south of Traverse City and NorthWest of Cadillac. In this edition, I'd like to close out the 2016 year with an update on the Cherryland ARC's own W8TCM repeaters, 146.860- (PL 114.8/YSF) and 442.500+ (PL 114.8).

At the CARC General meeting in November before the equipment auction (our program for that month), during the business portion of the meeting, the board-initiated idea of replacing the 442.500+ repeater (currently an analog only Kenwood by name but with replaced internals) with a Yaesu SystemFusion DR-1X repeater. Eventually the motion brought before the membership was voted on and passed, although with a contingency, which I'll discuss later in the article. I am happy to report, however, that the Yaesu DR-1X system was approved and will soon be replacing the current 442.500+ system. This offers the CARC (and repeater users) a few advantages we don't currently have. Here are the benefits:

1) Now either repeater unit can be used as a replacement for the other. Since the DR-1X is a dual-band repeater (can be used on 2m or 70cm) if the 146.86 repeater should fail, the new 442.5 DR-1X can be moved to 146.86 and the existing UHF machine can be re-deployed. Or if the 442.5 DR-1X fails the existing can just be re-deployed. (the current 442.5 system is small and easily re-placed into service. the same cannot be said for the VHF system)

2) Now both CARC repeaters will be capable of YSF Digital communications.

3) Now both CARC repeaters are new, "current technology" and can be serviced easily.

Back to the details of the voted-on and passed motion at the meeting. As with voted issues, there was a motion made, then seconded. Then discussion before voting. During the discussion, the question was raised about the current controller on the 146.86 repeater. There is a strong desire from user for a courtesy tone and other advanced features. Following discussion and a motion to modify the existing motion was passed, the new motion voted on carried a contingency that the CARC look into the 146.86 repeater with the intent to deploy a more capable controller for the Analog FM functions of the repeater.

A committee is being formed to perform discovery and recommendations to the board. If you're interested in this, please contact Joe N8CN at: joe@n8cn.org and we can get you involved in the process. The current "loose" plan is to procure Arcom ADR interfaces for each system and purchase an external controller capable of advanced features (and a beep!). A formal project scope and recommendations will be presented by the committee to the board in February.
