

If you've never seen a Cherryland ARC Field Day up close and in real time, you can always check out the video from our <u>Field Day in 2016</u> over on YouTube.. The video focuses on the elements that our club stresses each year - Food, Fellowship, Fun, Outreach, Innovation, and of course Amateur Radio! The Cherry Juice Jul The plan for 2018 is to operate using the club callsign W8TCM as "3A" - This means we will have three primary, constant stations running at all times (or as much as possible), and are in a "club" class for scoring and logging purposes.. The 3 primary stations will be:



- All-Band CW Hope AA8SN will be leading the efforts here, with much help from Ernie K8RCT, Mark KD8EDC and others. The CW station will operate on all bands using a multi-band wire antenna. They've used a G5RV and other dipoles in the past with great success.
- 40M Phone Joe KC8RLU will be coordinating this station. In the past, 5 switchable, directional dipoles suspended on a tower have been used, and this has worked tremendously well.
- 20M Phone Ward N8WK will be coordinating this station. Plans are to have a Yagi/Beam on the top of a tower for 20M.



In addition to our primary stations, the club will also be operating:

- VHF/Solar Joe W8TVT will be coordinating a special "bonus" station for VHF and UHF work that is completely solar-powered.
- GOTA (Get On The Air) Laura WZ8C will be coordinating our "GOTA" station which, while in operation, will be open for "anyone" to sit down

and try their hand at making contacts. This bonus station will use the callsign WZ8C and maintain a separate log, but all contacts made benefit the overall score. Anyone who would like to try out ham radio is welcome to sit down at the key/mic and try it out!

Beginning on July 18, local radio and television will be promoting the Cherryland ARC field day, so don't be surprised to hear about it on your local news!

The Schedule

1) Tuesday Night, June 19, 7pm. - In lieu of project night (we will NOT be meeting at the club room this week) we will be meeting out at Don WD8NRZ's farm. The address is 4786 E Hoxie Rd, Cedar MI. We will pick up the club's trailer, generators, necessary antennas, kits, feedline, tower sections, and other necessities. We will deliver these to the Field Day site at 10477 E Fort Rd, Suttons Bay, MI 49682.

2) Friday, June 22nd at 2:00 PM. - Major antenna and tower erection activities. This is when we start the heavy lifting for setting up the Field Day site. We really need your assistance!

3) Saturday morning, June 23rd. - Finish setting up
Field Day, install radios and get all the equipment
operational.Saturday afternoon, June 23rd – 2pm.
Field Day begins with all stations operating. Come on
out and operate or help log contacts. Everyone gets a
chance to get on the air! We have a special "Get On
The Air" station and coach for all our new hams.

4) Sunday, June 26th. - Operations continue until 2:00 PM when Field Day officially ends. Then the task of taking down the antennas and packing up the equipment begins. All hands on deck for taking down equipment and cleaning up the site.

Emergency Communications is Radio-Active!

The Traverse Bay Area Emergency Radio Group (TBARG for short) has been super-busy this year!

District 7 exercise on April 18

On April 18th, there was a District 7 exercise which heavily involved communications to, from , and within the Munson Healthcare system. The exercise included many interesting challenges throughout its schedule, including the simulated loss (shutdown) of all internet and telephone service. During this period of time, TBARG was able to sustain communications from Munson Medical Center to the EOC and several other entities using both voice and digital communications.

"Sending ICS-213 forms using FLMSG/FLDigi received a lot of comments, "looks like email without the Internet", "cool" and "keep up the good work". I found it interesting that the Android tablets (Amazon Fire Tablet) with no cables tended to have the greatest success sending messages in comparison to laptops with wired interfaces.

I especially liked the ease of printing the 213 forms with a few clicks of the mouse. I will have more feedback from Munson and other players in formal debriefing in the future. We are constantly looking to improve. My special thanks to Munson Healthcare for their encouragement and support of our services.

I look forward to working with the Charlevoix, Cheboygan, and Emmet hams who have elected to get credentials for working with Munson Emergency Communications. Overall, we continue to improve our skills and develop better relationships with emergency communication users in District 7. It is my belief that the best is yet to come. Again, my sincere thanks."

The feedback during the exercise was very positive, and Munson representatives relayed their sincere thanks and appreciation to all involved. Statewide EOC exercise on April 28th This was an interesting exercise, indeed. Multiple Ham Radio emergency communication groups from around the state worked for several hours during the Simulated Exercise. Mike Dell K8LMJ coordinated efforts to activate two locations in the Grand Traverse area who checked into the net and successfully passed traffic.

Working with the Mi5 group downstate, the local N8OUZ 442.2875+ repeater (operating the DMR digital mode) was temporarily moved from the TriStateDMR/DMRPlus network to Mi5 for the duration of the event.

We were able to communicate successfully to the SEOC (State EOC) using DMR, D-Star on the WI0OK repeater in Empire. We also used the K8WQK analog FM repeater for Nelson W8NWO, who was stationed in East Jordan and did not have a good Digital or HF path to the SEOC network. This proved that often, the KISS principle is the best, and works when other methods fail.

Mike reported that our efforts were successful, and that overall we had 7 counties represented from Region 7 during the exercise.
